**The role**

DCA is seeking an experienced **Protection Coordinator** to lead the strategic, technical and programmatic oversight of its protection portfolio in the DRC.

Based in Goma and working under the supervision of the Head of Programmes, the Protection Coordinator will define and roll out DCA's country protection strategy, ensure quality and harmonisation across multiple operational areas, and strengthen protection integration across sectors.

This is a senior technical role combining **strategic leadership, field-level quality assurance, team capacity strengthening, and external representation**.

**Key responsibilities**

- Lead DCA's protection strategy and harmonise tools and approaches across sites.
- Ensure quality delivery through technical supervision, field monitoring and protection mainstreaming across sectors.
- Strengthen MEAL, AAP and data protection, ensuring safe complaints/feedback and ethical information management.
- Represent DCA in coordination fora, strengthen referral pathways, and support advocacy.
- Support proposal development, donor reporting, and team performance, ensuring full safeguarding/PSEA compliance.
